1. Summary

At the 10 December 2008 meeting, the Board was advised that the work programme would continue to evolve, as the Comprehensive Area Assessment (CAA) process and GOL reporting requirements on the Local Area Agreement become clearer, and would be kept under review.

A revised and updated work programme is set out in Appendix 1. The main changes from that reported to the December meeting are:

- the inclusion at the 11 March meeting of a session on the Comprehensive Area Assessment framework and its implications for the borough
- consideration of the draft CAA self assessment on 22 April
- the presentation of the draft CAA Area Assessment on 10 June.
- the deferral of the planned session on youth crime from the 11 March to the 22 April meeting.
- the inclusion of a session at the 22 April meeting on the preferred options for the Local Development Framework Core Strategy, prior to their submission to the council Executive.

Further Board meetings will be scheduled presently.
